With everything now starting to open up, we now have a new challenge to work out a “New normal” of providing youth work using social distancing and PPE. Challenge on.

We are however pleased to launch the first of our exciting programs with a Hybrid of On Line and in house **Well Being Course**

Starting Tuesday 21st July and designed for 15 to 19 year old’s we are offering a 1 hour per week for 10 weeks on line sessions from 2pm till 3pm. Sessions will:

Explore: What is wellbeing, Recognising and understanding the purpose of emotions; Recognising problems; Adjusting behaviours; Discovering options; Connecting with what matters and being your best self; Planning for tough days and preparing for when things don't go to plan; Moving forward.

The November 2019 Gambling Commission report found that 11% of 11 – 16 year olds engaged in a gambling activity using their own money in the last seven days, and that 55,000 young people are affected by gambling related harm. Growing concern over the relationship between gaming, gambling and other risk-taking behaviours makes the YGAM programme highly relevant, especially given the current situation, we feel that now is a critical time to reach as many young people as possible.

The online session will cover:

- an overview of how young people are increasingly exposed to gaming and gambling.
- the influence of advertising, particularly around sporting events.
- the role of social media, in game purchases, loot boxes and Esports .
- the signs to look out for when an individual is at risk and where to seek help.
- a look at our resources that have been developed specifically to support practitioners to deliver to young people in educational and non-educational settings.
